SPECIAL COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

**Please note that the overarching emphasis is that anyone who can work remotely should still be doing so. As you are aware, we have shifted our services online. Our office remains closed at this time until further notice so that everyone stays healthy and we can continue to provide services to our students.

- Normally rooms are assigned to each grad student, mailboxes and keys/access cards also issued but this is all postponed until we are back on campus
- For anyone who needs to go to campus for specific reasons (eg. to run/record lectures, labs, tutorials; to work for specified time periods due to hardship of getting work done at home; to pick up supplies or belongings, etc.) here are the steps that need to be taken:
 - 1. Complete the online Covid-awareness training module. This must be done before you can attend campus:
 - Students can register for training on Mosaic. The course can be found in the regulatory training section, following this path: Home>Regulatory Training>Search by course name>Leave search field blank>Search>View available sessions, and proceed with your registration until reaching Submit.
 - It takes one day from when you sign up to when the training is made available on Avenue to Learn, so leave enough time to complete training before coming to campus. A record of completion will be available in Mosaic one business day after training has been completed.

SPECIAL COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

- 2. Obtain permission from your supervisor for a specific date and time. (For TA's, your supervisor for TA purposes is the course instructor.) That permission should then go through Laurie LeBlanc, as she will need to notify the Chair. Such permission will only be granted for a specific purpose and for specified times.
- 3. Complete a Covid self-assessment within an hour before you enter campus: https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/
 - New employees (TA's) can get their Working at McMaster ID card, which can then be programmed with building access: http://parking.mcmaster.ca/photoid.html. Please let Laurie know once you have your card if you need to access the building. For TA's, there are studio spaces that have been set up in some departmental rooms that may be booked by email to Delcia Aguiar (aguiad1@mcmaster.ca) if you need to use them for virtual or recorded lecture, tutorial, or lab sessions.

- McMaster Student Cards For graduate students who are residing in Ontario, your student card has been mailed to the current address in your Mosaic profile.
 Graduate students who do not currently reside in Ontario, will not receive their students cards via mail at this time.
- Please take time to review the regulations from our own CAS Graduate Handbook and also the School of Graduate Studies Calendar.
- All classes will be held online for the fall term and will be recorded. Please contact the instructor of the course for more information.
- Final date to ADD course in the fall term: September 25, 2020
- Final date to DROP course in the fall term: November 13, 2020
- Tuition Payment Deadline for fall term: September 25, 2020; for winter term:
 January 25, 2020; for spring/summer term: May 25, 2020. Late fees and interest
 will be charged to your student account after these dates if not paid in full for that
 term. Tuition is due in the first month of each term.

- Check your profile on Mosaic to make sure all information is correct program type/plan type/tuition amount/scholarships/etc.

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- SGS #101 Academic Research Integrity and Ethics: this is mandatory for ALL students. Must be completed this month (September). This course is an online course that should be added in MOSAIC and can be completed through Avenue to Learn (A2L)
- SGS #201 AODA (Accessibility for Ontarians with Disability Act): this is mandatory for ALL students. Must be completed this month (September). This course is an online course that should be added in MOSAIC and can be completed through Avenue to Learn (A2L)

- MUST be completed by September 30, 2020



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- Career Planning: Entering graduate students within the Faculty of Engineering are required to complete a career planning exercise within their first academic year (September August). This is a degree requirement which needs to be completed within your first year. Students can attend a career planning session with a career specialist within the Faculty and subsequently produce (at most) a two-page report before the end of their first year. The template can be found on our website. New students must attend a career planning seminar in order to complete their degree and will play a role in the writing of their career planning progression report. The seminar times/dates will be emailed to you.

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Health & Safety Training: All students are required to take the following courses in addition to any courses required by your supervisor or course instructor.
 These can be completed online through MOSAIC and Avenue to Learn (A2L) and should be done within the first week of the term if possible (Health & Safety Orientation; WHMIS; Asbestos Awareness; Ergonomics; Fire Safety; Slips, Trips & Falls; Violence and Harassment Program; Job Hazard Analysis (this must be done with your supervisor) You can find a full listing on the EOHSS website

**Optional

- Registration for the Co-op preparation course for Engineering Graduate Students
 (Engineer 701) is now open. The course will start on Wednesday, October 7,
 2020. This course is required for all graduate students who would like to seek co-op in the upcoming terms, and it is recommended that students take the course at least 2 terms ahead of when they would like to work for the best success in finding employment.
- There will be an information session held on September 15, 2020 from 11:00am
 11:45am for any students seeking more information. Please sign up on Oscar plus to attend this session and receive the Zoom Link.
- Here is the link to Oscar plus https://www.oscarplusmcmaster.ca/home.htm Log on and go to Engineering and then events to register and be a part of the meeting.
- Students that are enrolled in MASc, MSc and MEng programs are eligible to complete a co-op work term after completing 8 months of studies and PhD students are eligible after completing their comprehensive exam. To enroll in Engineering 701, the preparation course, you **MUST have your supervisor's approval!**



 Below is a table that shows when students are eligible to pursue co-op and how long they are able to work in a co-op position.

Program	When the student can work	Duration of Co-op Permitted

MEng	After 8 months of study	Up to 8 months for 2-year programs
MASc/ M.Sc	After 8 months of study	Up to 8 Months for 2-year programs
PhD	After 12 months of study	Up to 12 Months

- Other Important details:
- Students who want to pursue a co-op must complete 2 forms (Graduate Co-op Registration Agreement and the Graduate Supervisor Permission Form) and have them signed by their supervisor and program chair. They must be submitted to Christine Rich and copied to gradcas@mcmaster.ca. For a copy of those forms, you can email me.
- Students can find their own placement (it must be approved by our office) or they can apply to positions posted on the OscarPlus job board. Access to the OscarPlus job board is only granted for the terms approved by your supervisor and after completion of Engineer 701.
- All students have access to OscarPlus to see the events and sample resumes, etc., however, only those
 who have opted in to the co-op course and completed Engineer 701 will have access to see the jobs the
 ECCS team and employer partners posts on OscarPlus.
- Students who completed their engineering undergraduate degree at McMaster and completed 1EE0 or 2PW3 can have job board access and do not need to attend the Engineer 701 course. The co-op office still requires the 2 forms to be completed to allow them job board access for the specified terms and to show supervisor approval.
- Ideally, Master's students should complete the co-op course in their second term of school,
- PhD students should complete the co-op course after completing their comprehensive exam.
- ***If you are a student who receives a scholarship or TA, it is important to speak with your department administrator before registering for the co-op preparation course to learn how this may affect your funding.***



- For anyone who is interested, <u>please send your registration forms to</u>
 <u>Christine Rich via email by Friday, September 18, 2020.</u> As a reminder, if you are interested in pursuing a co-op work term during your studies, this course should be taken at least 2 terms prior to when you would ideally like to start a work term to allow ample time for your job search and to allow time to receive a co-op work permit which can take up to 5 months (required for international students).
