**Responsibilities:** Lecture six hours per week; set examinations, manage grades; supervise the teaching assistants who are responsible for two laboratory sections each week. Work with computer technician to ensure that laboratory software for class runs effectively. Hold office hours.

Applicants should hold a university degree in engineering or computer science. Strong communication skills are essential, and previous university teaching experience is highly desirable. Applicants must hold a P.Eng.
