A news story will be communicated shortly to the McMaster community with a ribbon cutting. We are the first University to install hem. If departments are considering buying an AED ensure you go through EOHSS or Facility Services as they will be nanaged centrally to maintain consistency for maintenance pads, batteries, etc.). All AED cabinets have been replaced on campus with the save station messaging. An AED will be nstalled in Campus Services Building soon. All AED ocations can be found on the AED portal website	

S. Tullis – wanted EOHSS to look at handling the distribution and care of the AED units more centrally. L. Allan will follow up with her team and report back regarding updates.	
The new RMM 100 Environmental Health & Safety Policy is posted, signed by the President of the University. The policy now highlights psychological safety.	
It was discussed that the Library did not feel safe in their environment because students were eating in the library and removing masks even when they were not eating. Remind students, visitors to wear their masks and properly.	
MacCheck App – what about construction workers? Who's checking the status of these people? It is up to the project manager and general contractors to ensure daily checks are done.
